Activities and Program Reports

Inauguration of COVA Community Centre, Kurmaguda, Hyderabad 26th May, 2024

COVA Community Center was inaugurated at Kurmaguda, Hyderabad on 26th May 2024 to secure entitlements and enable empowerment of people in four localities of Kurmaguda Ward and to foster harmony and peace between communities of the area.

These Centers will cater to 5000 houses through direct outreach and another 5,000 households through Awareness Programs and Campaigns.

Bro. K. R. Janga Reddy, Smt. Swati and Maulana Mustapha, Christian, Hindu and Muslim Faith Leaders offered Multi Faith Prayers. They invoked the blessings of the Almighty for success of the Community Center and hoped that it will bring together all communities and enable their comprehensive empowerment. They specially urged youth to take all benefits from the Center.

Empowerment: Groups of Youth, Women and Community Leaders will be formed for planning and organizing Development and Peace Programs in the Localities through collaborative initiatives that will include leadership and social media training, spoken English, awareness, career counselling, personality development programs, sports and recreation activities for youth.

Entitlements: Members of the localities will be facilitated to obtain proper documents like Aadhar Card, Pan Card, Bank Account, Caste Certificate etc and their linkages where ever required. This will help them to apply Online and access a wide range of Government Schemes and Programs. Locality members will also get guidance and help to give representations to government departments for problems and get redress properly

Social Harmony: An important component of the Program will be formation of Peace Groups in each locality for prevention of conflicts and promoting harmony, through Multi Faith Celebrations and greater interactions between different communities through sports, recreation and development programs.

Prominent citizens, representatives of organisations, community leaders, women activists and youth participated in the Inauguration Program. All welcomed the establishment of the Centre and offered their full collaboration, partnership and participation in the programs and activities

Inauguration of COVA Community Centre, Jangammet, Hyderabad 26th May, 2024



Another COVA Community Center was inaugurated at Bhatji Nagar, Jangammet Ward, Hyderabad on 23rd June 2024 to secure entitlements and enable empowerment of people in Six localities of Jangammet Ward and to foster harmony and peace between communities in these areas.

Mrs. Aparna Adhikari, Secy. COVA shared her views with women and people present in the program and assured to organise women awareness programs in near future as requested by the public. Localities and has started the process of formation of proper Sports Teams that will operate through Youth TRAC Centres.

These Teams will also organise awareness and capacity building programs. The Centres are dedicated to Holistic Development of Youth through Recreation and for Community Empowerment and Peace.

Over a hundred people - mostly youth and prominent citizens, representatives of organisations, Community Influencers, women activists and seven visitors from Los Angeles USA attended. It was resolved that apart from daily sports and recreation, fortnightly Awareness



Programs will be organised along with tournaments to bring together different teams on a regular basis. Some topics suggested by youth for the Awareness Programs are Personality Development, Spoken English, Career Counselling, Social Media and Leadership Training etc.

Multi Faith Celebration of Festivals will also be organised on a regular basis to promote better understanding of all religions and harmony in Society. The highlight of the Program was an interesting interaction between the locality teams and seven youth who had come from USA.

The discussion centred around gun culture in USA and its dangers, safety of women and opportunities for higher education in US. On the other hand the visitors enquired about the aspirations and hopes of the youth of India and the problems and obstacles faced by them in pursuing their dreams.

Inauguration of 7 COVA - Youth TRAC Sports and Recreation Centres at Jangammet Ward, Hyderabad 21st July 2024

Meetings of Development and Peace Groups

These are Monthly meetings of Development and Peace Groups to review and plan activities where all communities get involved and participate. The ideal number in these committees is 15 i.e. 5 youth, 5 women and 5 Basthi Leaders.



In almost all the 10 areas the committees are formed, but consistency is still to be achieved. At present 8 to 10 members are regular in different local committees and efforts are on to ensure atleast 15 members to participate on a regular basis. Till now 57 such meetings were organised in which on average 8 to 10 members are participated Regularly.

Good interactions are taking place and many new suggestions are coming from the people. Though we cannot address all their aspirations many new programs, events like Women's Awareness

Programs, Medical Camps etc. are evolving through these Locality Committee Meetings.

Aadhaar Camps

As a part of HDDP program in course of working for entitlements of the people we found that the Basic Document Aadhaar of many people is with lot of abnormalities. And the corrections cannot be done by anyone over online. Hence we approached Aadhaar Seva Kendra Regional Centre, Hyderabad for Collaboration. With the help of Aadhaar Seva Kendra we started organising 2 camps in a month one in each centre.



Till April 2025, 24 Aadhaar Camps were organised and 1955 members were benefitted through these camps. It comprises of New Aadhaar cards to children and Name, Address corrections and Biometric Updations for elders.

Along with Aadhaar Camps Awareness programs on basic entitlements were organised where the Aadhaar Officers present explained about Aadhaar

upadations, required documents, new Aadhaar facility etc.

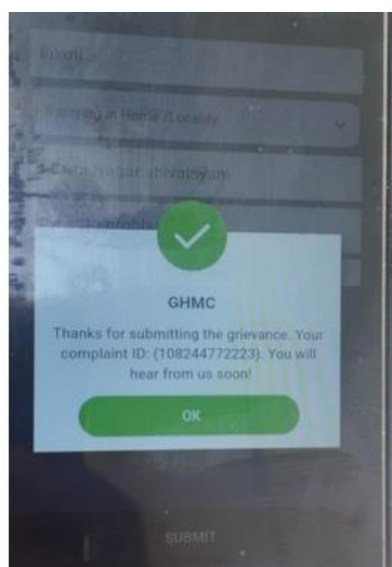
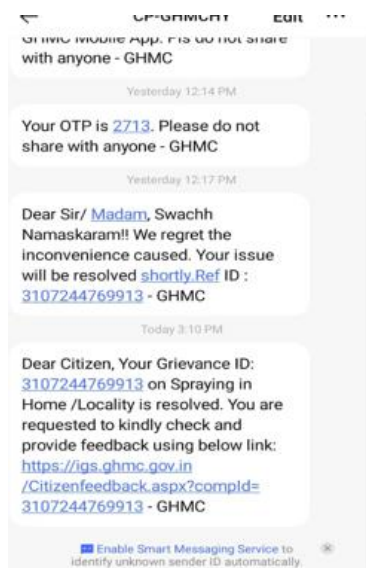

Awareness about Citizen Charters of GHMC, Electricity Department and Water Works

In the 2nd Phase of Program as many committee members and general people placed their problems of Civic Amenities like Garbage Lifting, Water Overflow, Power Problems etc. in community outreach meetings, we took awareness campaign about Citizen Charters and the Apps present to solve the Civic Problems. There is a very good response thousands of people downloaded the Apps and many started Complaining about the problems of concerned Departments. 90% of the Problems were attended by the Departments and were resolved. 10% of the problems, which require intervention and budget allocations from higher level are under persuasion.

Through community meetings and outreach in localities wide distribution of the pamphlets of 56 Services of GHMC, Water works, Electricity Board were taken up. And very good response received from the people for this activity. A drive has been taken up to download Citizen service Apps and complain about the civic problems in the slums.

By 30th April 2025, 1714 people downloaded the Apps, complaints were raised over Apps were 279 and among them 254 are resolved. People are also facing the problem of Polluted water which needs more persuasion and intervention by Higher Authorities.



Women Empowerment Programs

Special Women's Awareness Programs

Through discussions with Local People Women's Awareness Programs suggestion came for programs for awareness and empowerment of women. In response, COVA agreed to organise one program for women of two localities together every month.. Till April 2025, 15

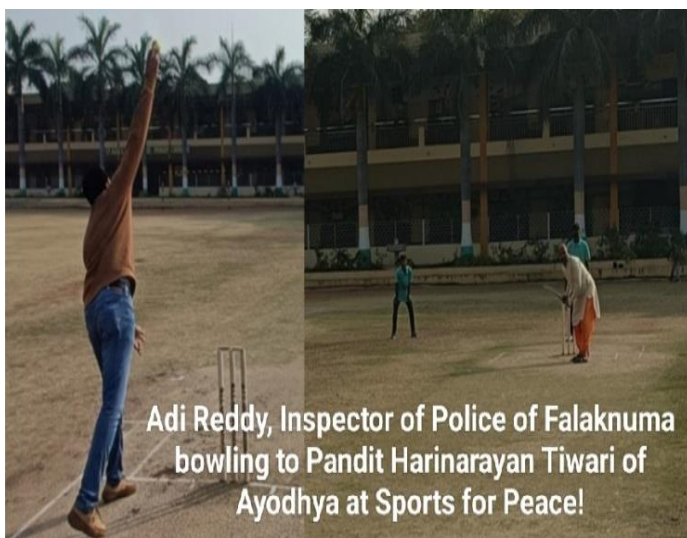

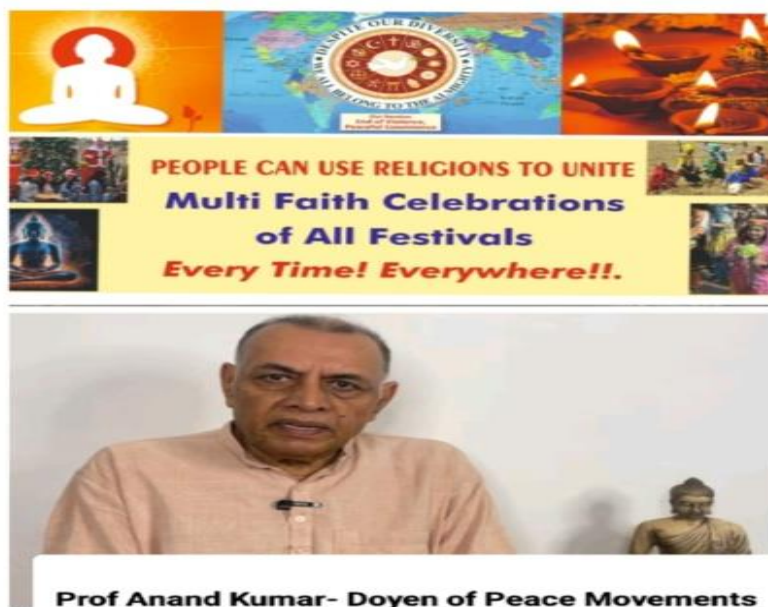

- Digital communication tools: email creation, WhatsApp usage, Meta AI integration.
- Online tools: Google Search, Maps, Play Store.
- Social media engagement: Facebook and Instagram account management.

- Enabling two-step verification.
- Updating device software and installing apps from trusted sources.
- Spotting fake messages, verifying URLs, and recognizing scams.
- Practicing safe online behavior and information sharing.

In CSC Blood Test Camps it is noteworthy that Nearly 35 test reports were given including HBA1C and Vitamin –D at free of cost. And in ENT camps by Akruthi Along with free Doctor Consultation Audiogram Tests are done and Basic Medicines are provided free of cost. Till now 526 members benefitted through these medical camps under this project.

Development and Peace Groups Meetings for Preparation of Annual Planning Meeting 2025-26

1. Introduction

This report summarizes the findings from a series of Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) conducted in various communities to assess public awareness and perceptions related to Government Schemes, Community Harmony, and Youth Awareness. The FGDs were conducted as part of a broader initiative to gather grassroots-level insights to inform policy and program development for the year 2025-2026.

2. Objectives

The main objectives of the FGDs were:

- To evaluate community awareness and understanding of various government welfare schemes.
- To explore community sentiments and practices regarding social harmony and inclusivity.
- To understand youth perspectives, aspirations, and levels of civic and social engagement.

3. Methodology

Participants: Community members including youth, women, local leaders, and elders.

Dates & Locations: 3rd April, Nayak Nagar Banjara Community Hall

7th April, Nayak Nagar, Banjara Community Hall

11th April, Nayak Nagar, Banjara Community Hall

13th April, Jangammet, Arya Samaj

14th April Jangammet, at DPG member's House

Tools Used: Discussion guide, note-taking, and observation checklists.

4. Key Findings

A. Government Schemes

- Awareness: Mixed levels of awareness. Some participants could name key schemes on Senior Citizens Pension, Single Women pension while others had limited or no knowledge.
- Access Issues: Common barriers include lack of documentation, poor information dissemination, and bureaucratic delays.
- Suggestions: More outreach through local media, community volunteers, and regular information camps.

B. Community Harmony

- Perception: Generally peaceful coexistence reported, though occasional issues arise around political or religious events.
- Initiatives: Communities appreciate festivals, sports events, and interfaith meetings as means of fostering harmony.
- Concerns: Misinformation on social media and lack of youth engagement were noted as potential threats.

C. Youth Awareness

- Engagement: Youth are enthusiastic but feel underrepresented in decision-making.

- Needs Identified: Skill development, employment opportunities, and platforms for civic participation.
- Challenges: Migration for jobs, lack of local opportunities, and peer pressure were recurring themes.

5. Recommendations

- Strengthen local awareness campaigns about government schemes through grassroots workers.
- Promote inclusive events that build mutual respect and social bonds.
- Involve youth in planning and implementation of community programs.
- Establish youth centers or clubs that offer training, mentorship, and civic education.

6. Conclusion

The FGDs revealed valuable insights into community dynamics, policy awareness, and youth aspirations. Continued engagement with local populations will be key to bridging knowledge gaps and building more inclusive and effective development strategies.

Annual DPG Meeting-19th April 2025

Participants: 80 DPG Members and 7 Resource Persons

Introduction

The Annual Meeting with the Development and Peace group (DPG) members was successfully conducted on 19th April 2025 at the COVA office. The event witnessed active participation from 60 DPG members and seven expert resource persons. The primary objective of the meeting was to encourage collective reflection, exchange of ideas, and strategic planning for addressing community challenges.

Participant Grouping

To ensure focused discussions and inclusive participation, attendees were divided into the following thematic groups based on their backgrounds and interests:

1. **Home Makers Group**
2. **Youth Group**
3. **Political and Local Community Leaders Group**
4. **Minority Group**
5. **Working People Group**
6. **Social Workers (Asha/Anganwadi/SHG)**

This categorization enabled context-specific dialogue and allowed for the diverse experiences of community members to be shared and understood.

Group Discussion Topics

Each group engaged in discussions around critical community themes. The topics explored were:

1. **Awareness and Issues Regarding Government Schemes and Documentation**
Discussions focused on the accessibility of government welfare schemes, barriers in

documentation processes, and suggestions to improve awareness and outreach at the grassroots level.

2. **Youth: Problems and Solutions**

This session addressed key challenges faced by youth, including unemployment, lack of skills, and social pressures. The participants proposed various community-based interventions and skill development opportunities.

3. **Harmony in Family and Neighborhood**

The discussion emphasized the importance of maintaining peaceful relationships within families and communities. Participants shared practical ideas for conflict resolution, mutual respect, and community-building practices.

The Outcome

The DPG Annual Meeting served as a platform for reflection, dialogue, and collective problem-solving. The insights shared by different groups will inform future interventions by COVA and partner organizations. The active participation and meaningful contributions of all members and resource persons were highly appreciated. This gathering reaffirmed the commitment of DPG members to foster inclusive development, social harmony, and grassroots empowerment.

Adoption of Programs and Activities for 2025-26

The final DPG meeting marked the successful conclusion of the annual planning cycle. The collective agreement and adoption of the new activities and Programs reflect the commitment of all stakeholders to strengthen community-level planning and ensure more participatory governance. Follow-up actions and monitoring mechanisms will ensure that the adopted reforms are implemented effectively and sustainably.
